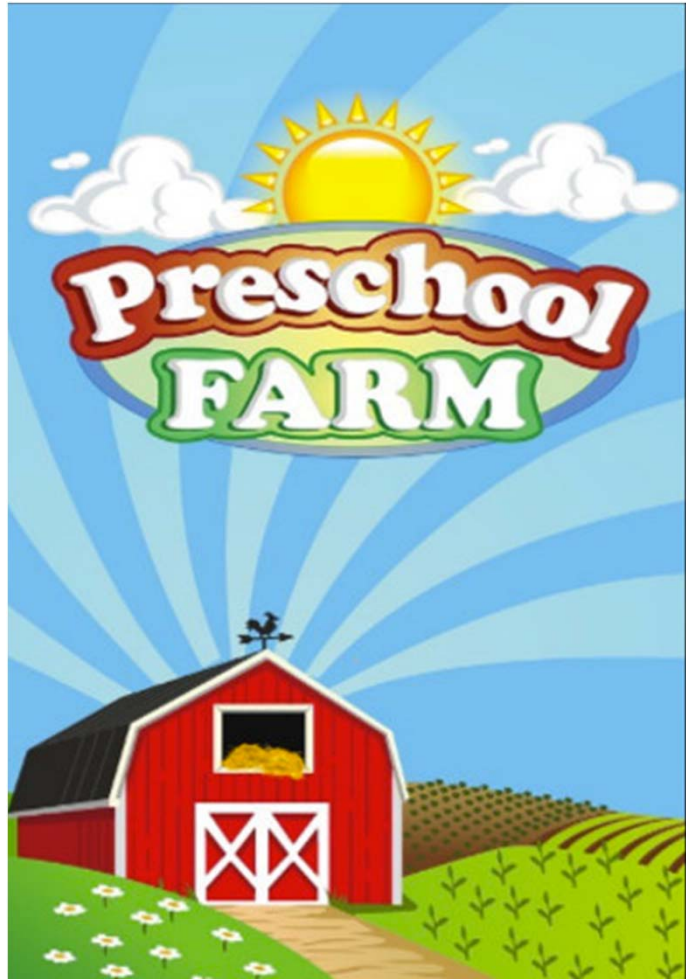

So visit us and explore your favourite fairy tale or nursery rhyme .

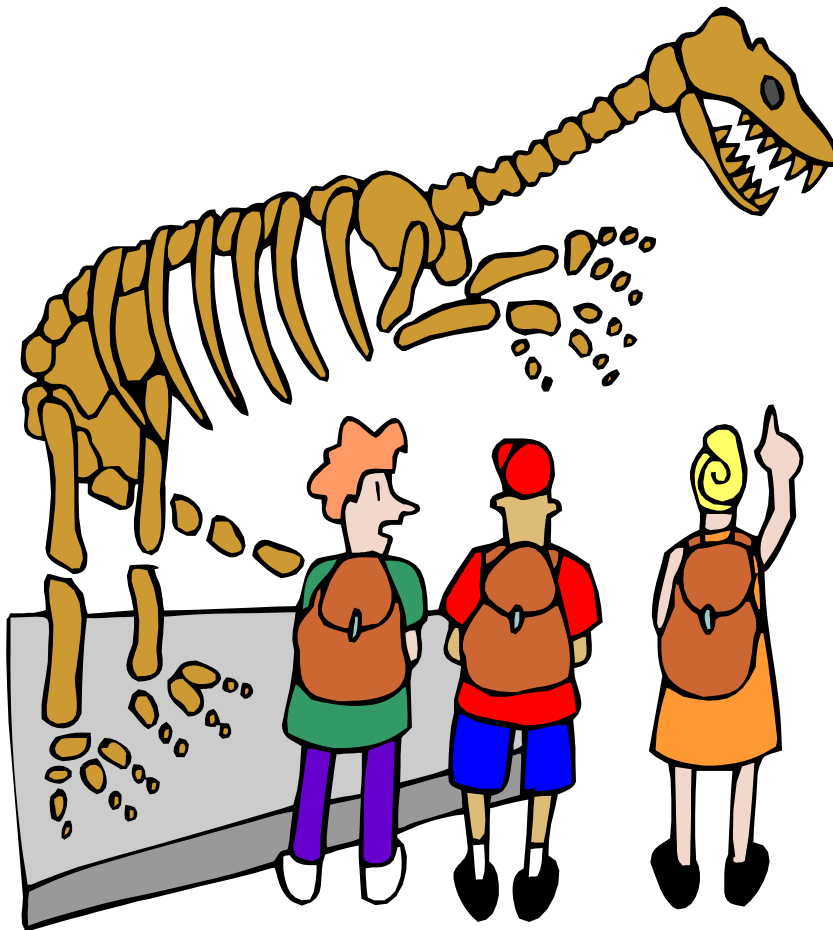

Also, look out for our salt dough dinosaur fossils and footprints!

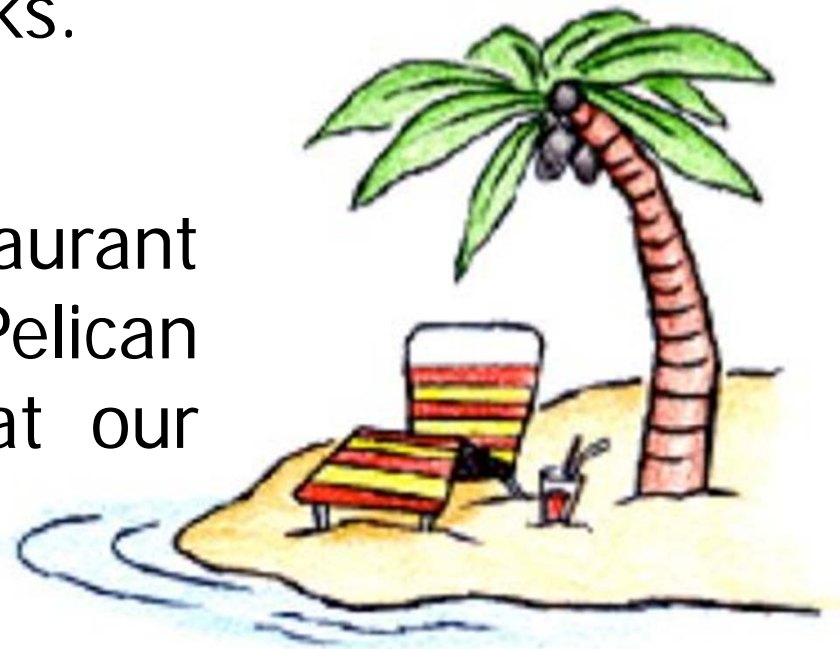
