Each year we dedicate a week to learning about wildlife in our local environment. Turtle week follows on from our successful Osprey and Shark Weeks in years past. This week focuses on discovering more about our chosen animal, how they are a part of our local ecosystem, conservation projects here in the TCI and how we can play a role in their protection and preservation.



We hope that our local wildlife weeks will inspire an interest in our children and help them to develop and grow up with an outlook in which they can see ways in which they can truly make a difference. Many times wildlife populations are negatively affected because people are simply unaware of the consequences of their actions. As our children become more aware and knowledgeable, they will then able to share this knowledge with other people. Friday (Earth Day 2016)



Liz and Daniel from the <u>Lempen Puppet Theatre Company</u> came in this week and introduced us to the world of puppetry. It was wonderful to see some of their turtle puppets close up. They will be back on Friday 22nd to do a puppet workshop with our Year 5 and 6.

The Lempen Puppet Theatre Company are working together with the UK based Marine Conservation Society, TCFAF and various other organisation to bring a series

of workshops and theatrical performances to students across our islands. The project is focused on raising awareness about sustaining healthy turtle populations. We feel very fortunate to be able to be included in this project.

During the workshop, children will learn about puppet making and how to animate puppets and will make some turtle puppets. They will also be encouraged to think creatively about how we learn from stories and how we communicate ideas through story and performance.

They will explore the story of 'Fisherman Joe and the Three Brothers' - a story written in partnership with The Marine Conservation Society that explores the shared responsibility of caring for our marine environment and new laws on turtle conservation.

Artist, Lucie Winton Stubbs, from <u>Driftwood Studios</u> will be coming in to work with our Year 3 and 4 classes on Friday. Under her guidance, each child will create their own turtle painting on canvas with acrylic paints.


