Hummingbird News Desk!

<u>Curriculum and Topic Information</u> : In the Hummingbird class, all topics are designed to encourage creativity, curiosity and a love of learning. By focusing learning on one topic area, children are able to apply newly acquired skills in a meaningful way across the curriculum. Our topic this term is **The Animals and Plants of The**

Turks and Caicos Islands. In this topic we will be learning all about a variety of local plants and animals, using stories such as 'Where is Simon, Sandy?' We will have fun growing a variety of plants and will learn about animals such as Potcakes, iguanas and whales that can be found across our beautiful islands. To help you support your child at home, you will find more detailed curriculum and timetable information in the Parent Information Booklet and the Year 1 curriculum map for this term.

Homework : In Year 1, reading is so important and so much fun. I will continue to send home books for you to share with your child. These will be changed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week. Please try to encourage your child to bring in their books on these days so that they can read the maximum amount of books available to them. This continuity will help your child to become the best reader that they can be. After completing the reading books from the Year 1 classroom, your child will be encouraged to move over to the library where they will choose books which will be brought home in their individually decorated Book Bags. This term, Year 1 homework will also consist of weekly spellings to learn and a Math's activity that reinforces the work being carried out in class that week. No more than 20 minutes should be spent on these activities unless your child wishes to continue. I hope you find this information helpful.
