## **Mathematics**

➤ Numbers — 1:1 correspondence count objects to 20, recognise numerals to 10 and then 20.

Shape, space and measure – order items by length (hands and feet), height and weight. Begin to use positional language.



➤ Self-confidence & self-awareness — Enjoy responsibility of carrying out small tasks; Become confident to speak to others about their needs, wants and interests.

➤ Managing feelings & behaviour — Be aware of own feelings and know their actions can hurt others' feelings. Begin to accept needs of others, take turns and share resources.

Amazing

➤ Making relationships — Play in a group, initiate conversation, take into account opinions of others.

Literacy

➤ Reading — Know that print has meaning. Join in with rhymes and repeated phrases. Begin to recognise letters and simple words.

Writing – Hear and say the initial sounds in words; segment and blend words and link sounds to letters, names and sounds. Physical Development

Moving & handling —Hold a pencil between thumb and fore finger, copy letters from their name and begin to form recognisable letters. Use one handed tools and equipment.

Health and self-care — Dress without help for P.E. Observe the effects of activity on their body. Understand the safety of equipment and tools.

## Understanding the world

- ➤ People and Communities Talk about significant people, events and memories in their lives.
- ➤ The world Talk about things they have observed including why things happen and how things work.
- ➤ Technology Know how to operate simple equipment like a cd player. Open an app on a tablet and complete a task

## Communication & Language

- Listening & Attention Follow directions and instructions; Join in with rhymes and stories. Maintain attention, concentrate and sit quietly during appropriate activities.
- Understanding Respond to simple instructions involving preposition such as 'under' 'on' 'top' 'behind' and begin to understand 'why' and 'how' questions.
- Speaking Question why things happen and give explanations. Use a range of tenses, intonation, rhythm, and phrases to convey meaning



Construct and manipulate materials with purpose in mind selecting appropriate resources.

Being imaginative – Begin to build stories around toys and use resources as props to support role play.
