Reports and Parent Consultation Meetings

At the end of next week, school reports go out to all parents of children in Kindergarten to Year 6. These aim to provide information about where children are in their learning, social and behavioural development. Your child's report will highlight their many strengths and celebrate areas of enjoyment. It also communicates where further support, reinforcement or extension would be of benefit.



In these January reports, teachers will comment on how the children have resettled at the beginning of Term 2, reflect on progress in Term 1 since your Parent/Teacher Meeting last term and report on end of term 1 assessments in the core subject areas.

Optional Parent/Teacher Consultation Meetings are offered for families or teachers wanting an opportunity to discuss these further. Please connect with your child's teacher to arrange a convenient time if you would like to have a meeting.

Early Years parents are more than welcome to arrange Parent/Teacher Consultation Meetings as well, if they wish. Written reports are created at the end of the year for children in our Toddlers, Preschool and Junior Kindergarten classes.

Obligatory Kindergarten to Year 6 Parent/Teacher Consultation Meetings are then held at the end of this second term.

Secret Angel Week (Monday 6th - Friday 10th February)

Look out for happy, happy teachers this week. Secret Angel week is a special time where all of our staff gets to experience a little love and appreciation. This will be the fourth year that we have enjoyed having a 'Secret Angel' event. A bit like a 'Secret Santa', we each are assigned someone to shower with surprises over the week. Last year some of our older class joined in with a 'Secret Angel Day' so look out to see if your class will be joining in this year.

teachers/parents will be reading stories in the classrooms and around the school. Let your child's teacher know if you would like to read a story. The PTA has offered to provide cookies and milk to add to the evening's bedtime story time atmosphere.


