Playground News:

You may have noticed that a few developments in our playground enhancement project have made over the summer.

Forts, Gazebos and Imaginary Play:

Our two older forts were replaced with a large fort kindly donated by Natalie Zaidan and Ryan Jones. Funded by The PTA, the new play structure was repositioned, repaired, painted and generally spruced up by Cesar Castillo and the team at Environmental Arts.

As a bonus, we were then able to attach one of the old slides – a winning combination making it all the more exciting for the children! I am sure you will agree it looks absolutely fantastic and it is certainly a welcome upgrade to the playground. A big thank you to Natalie, Ryan, Cesar, our school maintenance team and the PTA who all collaborated on this project.

Environmental Arts also installed some artificial grass that had been donated by a client. One piece was laid in the garden gazebo area and the other in our newly replaced shaded area at the back of the Year 2 classroom. These areas now look stunning and are actively being used as a result.



Loose Parts: Progress is also underway with our 'Loose Parts' play area outside the JK Pelican room. Loose parts are easily moved materials that may be used by children while playing. They can be carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, taken apart and put back together in multiple ways.

We are currently busy collecting 'loose parts' – wood off-cuts, plumbing piping, conduit piping, cable and rope spindles, tyres etc. Jim Dunlop (Estel Plumbing) is gathering a collection of interlocking piping for us and various construction companies are passing on off-cuts and left over materials – thank you Damon Trottman (Horton Construction), Jamie Bachelder and Stephanie Gaudet (TCI Millworks), The Shore Club and Solie Williams (Provo Electric). We have a storage area set up and our water barrel that will collect and supply water for water play is up and running. Supplies will need to continue to be topped up so if you have any materials to offer or can assist with their collection and delivery, please let us know. We are especially interested in gathering more scooter tyres and strong crates/containers for storage!

Over the next couple of weeks, the Year 1 and 3 classes will be working together to help us develop the area and label all of the storage containers. Hopefully before mid-term, our 'Loose Parts' area should be fully up and running with the children actively able to engage in creative play.



We also still have plans for our wooden tepee, boat and our imaginary play village area to be created and to place the other slide in a new inventive way. During National Heritage Month we will be engaging in a number of playground projects which hopefully will link in with these plans and help us to bring them to reality. So there are even more exciting playground enhancements to look forward to ahead!

Soccer Netting: Have you noticed our new soccer netting behind the goal on the field perimeter fence? It's difficult to spot but it's really helpful in catching those 'rare' offgoal shots that previously flew into the bush. A big thank you to our parents who donated this and also to Chris Bryan and Projetech for donating time and resources for the installation of this.

Early Years Playground: In the Early Years playground, the new PTA funded trikes and Jingle Jam fort, parachute and stepping stones are a big success with our younger children!

Thank you everyone! Our Playground Enhancement Project is a wonderful reminder of how our community can come together to improve this essential and invaluable
