In Osprey class, the curriculum is delivered through termly topics that have creativity at their root. Rather than teaching each subject autonomously, they are woven and embedded into a topic. Children are encouraged to take ownership of their learning by participating in the planning. At the end of each term, we will have lots of learning to share and celebrate that will showcase what <u>their</u> ideas and planning have culminated in.

Our first topic is called '*True Detectives*'. This Literacy, History, Social Studies and Science focused topic includes looking at the chronology of their lives, how families are different, how they change over time and the similarities and differences between life for children now and in the past. In addition, we will research which food groups we need to maintain a balanced diet, how to keep fit and the life cycles of animals around us. We will produce self-portraits and family trees in our Art & Design and Design and Technology lessons, as well as strengthening our investigation and writing skills through our topic book, Nate the Great.
