#### Communication & Language Listening and Attention

 Concentrates intently on an object or activity of own choosing for short periods.

#### Understanding

- Understands single words in context is developing, e.g. 'cup', 'milk', 'daddy'
- Stops and looks when hears own name.
- Responds to the different things said when in a familiar context with a special person (e.g. 'Where's Mummy?', 'Where's your nose?)

### Speaking

- Enjoys babbling and increasingly experiments with using sounds and words to communicate for a range of purposes (e.g. *teddy, more, no, bye-bye.*)
- Uses sounds in play, e.g. 'brrrm' for toy car.
- Uses pointing with eye gaze to make requests, and to share an interest.



# Literacy

## Reading

- Handles books and printed material with interest.
- Has some favourite stories, rhymes, songs, poems or jingles

## Writing

• Uses various marking tools such as: pencil, crayons, markers, paintbrushes and fingers to make marking.

## Physical Development Moving and Handling

- Climbs confidently and is beginning to pull themselves up on nursery play climbing equipment.
- Passes toys from one hand to the other. Health and Self-care
- Shows some awareness of bladder and bowel urges.
- Develops own likes and dislikes in food and drink.



# A Celebration of Colours



## Understanding the World People and Communities

• Is curious about people and shows interest in stories about themselves and their family.

## The World

- Knows things are used in different ways, e.g. a ball for rolling or throwing, a toy car for pushing
- Explores the colours of their food
- Identifies colours of animals during story time (e.g. Brown bear, red bird etc.)

## Technology

- Explores old phones, cameras, computer, radio
- Operates mechanical toys (cars)
- Anticipates repeated sounds, sights and actions, e.g. when an adult demonstrates an action toy several times.

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development Making Relationships

- Plays cooperatively with a familiar adult, e.g. rolling a ball back and forth.
- Is aware of others' feelings, for example, looks concerned if hears crying or looks excited if hears a familiar happy voice.
- Interested in others' play and starting to join in.

## Mathematics Numbers

- Says some counting words randomly.
- Recites some number names in sequence.
- Knows that things exist, even when out of sight

## Shape, Space & Measure

- Notices simple shape and patterns in pictures
- Attempts, sometimes successfully, to sort shapes into spaces on inset boards or jigsaw puzzles
- Enjoys filling and emptying containers.



## Expressive Arts and Design Exploring and using Media and Materials.

- Imitates and improvises actions they have observed, e.g. clapping or waving.
- Begins to move to music, listen to or join in rhymes or songs.
- Uses different medias to explore colour
- Dresses up during role play
