- Literacy: Biographies/autobiographies, non-fiction & information texts linked to our geography topic Waterways; and our Science topic of adaptation and variation. We will also study the theme of adventure through our core literature text Holes by Louis Sachar. Students will also create a digital story book using suitable iPad apps.
  - Numeracy: number, calculations, problem solving, shape, space & measures and data handling. Practical application of these areas and building upon financial capabilities.
  - Science: adaptation & variation/Inheritance and Evolution.
  - Social Studies: thematic exploration of rivers, waterfalls,
    lakes, oceans and reefs.





- PSHCE Topic: What Makes Me, Me?
- Art/Technology Design: portraits, timelines, animal sketching, landscapes and modelling.
- Spanish: Year 6 progression (with Mrs. Yorka)
- P.E.: Fitness, squash and kickball.
- Music/Dance and Theatre Arts: Year 6 Progression (with Ms. Alison and Mrs. Niki.

## General Reminders!
